- You Won't Have to Bother Turning the VPN On/Off

Put simply, you might even forget that you are connecting through a VPN at times – it's that simple to automate the process! Basically, the router you are using will always connect to the Internet through the VPN. As a result, you don't need to log into PureVPN on all your devices anymore every time you want to use it.

- Most Importantly of All, You Can Use the VPN on All Sorts of Devices

Yes, you won't have to deal with limitations anymore. While PureVPN does work on the most common device types (Linux, Windows, OSX, iOS, Android), there are some limits to what it can do. Well, if you set it up on your router, that won't be a problem anymore. You can basically use the VPN on your Xbox or smart TV this way. The same goes for any other device that can securely connect through the VPN.

That's right – you can actually watch geo-restricted content on your TV. That also means all the data you have on any device will be safe thanks to our military-grade encryption. Now doesn't that sound awesome?

- How Do You Set up PureVPN on a Router?

Now, let's get one thing out of the way first. Yes, if you want, you can just share the VPN connection through the device you use. However, we advise against it. Why? Because you'll experience a serious decrease in online browsing speeds. The far better option is to run PureVPN

through a [DD-WRT](#) or [Tomato-enabled router](#) that supports PPTP or OpenVPN.
